

## 5. The Annual Applied Digital Projected Image Competition

Members may submit up three (3) digital images in this competition, but not more than a total of four (4) in this and the Annual Open Digital Image Competition that runs concurrently. They must comply with the rules pertaining to an applied entry. All the images used are from photographs taken by the author.

The member with the winning image will hold the Annual Applied Projected Image Trophy for one year and also receive a Glass Trophy (or other suitable memento).

1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> places will receive a certificate

Only **paid up** members are eligible for entry to the competition.

**Digital images and digital copies of prints** must be in JPEG format. Images may be of any size, not wider than 1600 pixels, not higher than 1200 pixels.

Entries should each have a title and be in a folder

(see separate instruction if you are intending to email your entry).

The title of the folder should be 'Your Membership Number (space or hyphen) the Competition (Annual Applied DPI).

As an example, my folder for the Annual Open Print entry, would read ; - '277 Annual Applied DPI 2018'

**Submissions** must be given to the Competition Secretary [or other specified recipient] on or before the date specified in the syllabus and/or on our web site.

The Folders should be on a memory stick, or disc.

**Emailed Entries;** If you choose to email the images, please put your membership number, the competition (Annual Applied DPI) in the subject bar. Then attach your images, **but always** send 'Applied' and 'Open' entries separately.

**All Images submitted** to competitions must have been photographed by the entrant.

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**An image** can only be entered into this competition once, but the same image may be entered into one Clubman competition, one Annual, one Maurice Biglin Wildflower competition, one Triptych competition and one Monthly on line competition.

**Identical** digital images and prints shall be considered to be the same image, unless substantially modified.

**Members shall** at all times have control over the use of their property. Copies of images may be used on the Club website, in publicising the club and in YPU or Inter-Club competitions.

Members must inform the competition secretary if they do not want their images used in this way.

**Judges** appointed are empowered to decide eligibility of entries and mark down as they feel fit.

**A Judge will be appointed** by the Competition Secretary, to judge the Annual competitions. The Judge will be invited to comment on each image, select 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> places and award Commended or Highly Commended classification to as many images as he wishes. The scoring of images is not a requirement for this competition.

### **What is Applied Photography?**

Basically a straight record of the subject. This may be a building, manmade object, or a nature subject. People and/or domestic animals are not normally acceptable.

The title of the picture should just describe the building, object or nature subject as accurately as possible. The images should portray the building, object or nature subject as sharp and accurately as possible.

You can clean up the image and correct colour balance, contrast, etc, but you must not add anything that was not there, or take out anything that was actually there.

If anyone needs more advice they should ask the competition secretary, or the

general secretary for an opinion.

**Competition rules** and any amendments will be published on the club's web site.

**All images entered** into an Applied section will be scrutinised by the Competition Secretary or his delegated representatives to ensure that the image meets the criteria for entry into the Applied section. Though he/she will always consult with senior members of the club before rejecting an image.

If you would like guidance on the acceptability of an image, please submit it at least one week earlier than the normal hand in date and request advice.

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
